BILINCSI LAJOS: Professional guiding principles for the development of college libraries. Draft.—The draft was prepared on behalf of the Ministry of Culture by the Council of College Library Leaders. In addition to the detailed description of college library functions it includes the principal guiding numbers for housing, stock, some fields of work and services. [341–357.p.]

FREY TAMÁSZNÉ: On the margin of a dissertation or the lessons of a citation analysis.—In her library science doctoral dissertation Veronica Frances Barcer searches the reply what kind of acquisition policy suits to today's inflationary period and to increased demands, where and how can one rely on other institutions, national services. Barcer carried out her investigations at the University Library, Dundee, based on 14 352 references in 126 dissertations covering 10 subject fields. In the present article Barcer's modern investigation methods and conclusions are described comparing the results with similar investigations conducted at the Central Library of the Budapest Technical University. TÓTH DEZSŐ: Utilization of the Videotex system in the dissemination of bibliographical information.—Nowadays, the significance of information is increasing both in production and education. The establishing of an up-to-date pedagogical information system cannot be postponed. Till the implementation of computers utilization of the Videotex system for the dissemination of pedagogical innovations could hasten the process. The article proposes such a utilization outlining theoretical and practical tasks of realization. In the first phase information dissemination of pedagogical innovations, later in all subject field could be solved by utilizing Videotex. [366–371.p.]

HEGEDŰS PÉTER – SZALKAI ISTVÁNNÉ – ÉKES ILDIKÓ: Problems of qualified youth atarting their career in social science libraries.—The authors investigated in 7 institutions the problems of qualified young people adapting themselves to their new working place. It was proved that their joining in scientific activities is well under the possibilities. Personal tasks are in want and in many cases young people do not see their perspective in the long run. The wage and rewarding policy of institutions reflect also the faultiness of cadre management. It is general, that the wage of university qualified persons, as compared with other categories, falls behind. The proportion of leaders under the age 35 is low. In order to "keep" qualified young people at the start of their career, local organizations of the Young Communist League cannot do much. [372–380.p.]

FÉNYES MIKLÓS: Activity of the Council of University Library Directors in 1980–1981.—This Council functioned according to its Organizational Statutes. During these two years its most important work was the elaboration of development guiding principles for university libraries (published in Könyvtári Figyelő, 5.no. 1981, 325–336.p.). Besides, it discussed a number of problems concerning university libraries. [000–000.p.]

HORVÁTH TIBOR: Interrogation marks in the matter of subject departments.—This theme became timely because in Hungary the larger public libraries are looking for their new organizational solvings; many of them discover it in the departmentalized libraries. The author's counter-arguments are: 1. the departmentalized library is practically an independent library; nowadays, when data transmission is realizable such kind of libraries are out of date.—2. libraries organized in subject departments are more expensive, costs are not in proportion to the output. 3. besides the old problems of departmentalized libraries (so-called general department, catalogues, etc.) new ones are added: problems caused by new kinds of media. The author does not reject fully the concept of departmentalized libraries but attaches great importance to their establishment with a more detailed analysis. [000–000.p.] 384–388 .
