Cordially then, inviting to this same Congress the Representatives of all such Societies as sympathize with us, we at the same time, request them to afford us the help of their advice now, in the choice of Subjects to be treated, naturally subjects of common interest, to one and all of these Societies, Subjects which should be based on the soundest and broadest principles of Humanity, most calculated to advance our great and noble cause; and object, namely, the Suppression of Cruelty in Man, which helps so powerfully the Work of real Civilization, in all countries!

At the same time we beg to be kindly favoured with the names of those gentlemen who may be entrusted with, or feel inclined to accept, this Mission, and this with the above mentioned Treatises, if possible, before the end of December, 1894, time being short.

We hope, our Friends in all Countries will help us at this Congress, to extend the higher ideas concerning the right of the defenceless among the lower Creation, to that love and consideration towards animals to whom we owe so much, which can only ennoble the Heart and Mind of Man.

Begging you, once more, to grant us a lively interest in our wishes, in the Name of our Society, we have the honour Sir 1.
